Day-to-day

My day-to-day work involves directly liaising with client contacts and expatriate assignees with regards to the income tax queries and issues they might have. The Japan Practice team focuses on making sure that Japanese expatriate assignees of our clients are fully compliant with UK income tax legislation.

I am in contact with the UK revenue service (HMRC) on daily basis, and I help Japanese expatriate individuals with any queries they might have. I coordinate preparation of income tax returns and other documents related to income tax compliance with overseas offices as well as internal UK firm teams.

Finally, I regularly visit clients at their offices to develop strong business relationships and to keep up-to-date with any issues the clients might have in terms of their income tax compliance, as well as their wider business.
