Training and development

Training and development will be ongoing throughout your career at KPMG. You may also have the opportunity to study for an accredited qualification in a technology specialism, depending on business need, which will assist you throughout the graduate programme and in your future career.

The exact nature of your training will be influenced by the type of work you're engaged in and your project roles, however it is likely to incorporate both formal and informal training and support to develop your tax and technology skills.

Additionally, we will provide you with on-the-job coaching and access to wide-ranging training that will help you manage your time, influence stakeholders, manage finances and lead others.

Will I work with other teams?

What types of projects will I work on?

Is there much travel involved in the role?

Pre-COVID-19, you would have worked most days from our offices in Canary Wharf, London. Of course, we have adapted to the current environment and so for the time being, would largely expect home working. This is flexible and there will be opportunities to work from the office, where there is an appetite for it and Government guidelines permit this. There will sometimes be the opportunity to travel to client offices which may also include occasional travel abroad, though increasingly we are adapting our approach from this perspective and expect more of these meetings to be undertaken virtually.

What happens after I finish my graduate programme?

The graduate programme has been designed to equip you for a career in Tax and Technology Consultancy. This is a fast-growing business within KPMG, offering a wealth of opportunity for you following completion of the graduate programme.

This meant that whilst there was some initial disruption, we were quickly able to ensure our students could continue with their exam pathways where individuals were comfortable to do so. These newly developed solutions may well continue to be used into the future, and thus will provide extra flexibility for our business and trainees.
